

Dog License

ALL DOGS over the age of 5 months are required to be licensed, by Wisconsin State Law. The Village has in the past relied entirely on dog owners to voluntarily license their dogs. However in 2016, the Village Ordinance Enforcement Department as well as the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department will begin issuing Municipal Citations in the amount of **\$218.50** to the owners of unlicensed dogs. The cost to obtain an annual dog license is \$5 for spayed or neutered dogs and \$11 for non-spayed or neutered. After March 31st there is a \$10 late penalty per license.

Please bring in your proof of rabies when licensing your dog.

Also, on May 21, 2016, the Village of Paddock Lake will be accepting electronics (computers, telephones, printers, etc. and televisions) at NO charge drop off will be at the Village Public Works facility at 23201 62nd St., Paddock Lake. Hours of drop off are 8:00 am until noon.

THOSE *^#@*!* MOSQUITOS

With a warmer than average winter, we are likely to experience a bumper crop of mosquitos. There are several preventative steps our residents can take to reduce mosquitos. The following are those steps:

- Empty containers with standing water after each rain fall
- Ensure that roof rain gutters are functional and have no standing water or wet leaves.
- Areas in yards that hold water can be treated with vegetable oil or dishwashing soap at a rate of one table spoon per 100 square feet of standing surface water.
- Clean out wet leaves and yard waste from inside driveway culverts and ditch lines.
- Trim trees and shrubs to allow sunlight to reach shaded areas.
- Remove wet leaves and or vegetation from beneath wood frame decks and patios.

Slow-No-Wake Hours
on Paddock Lake

Monday 7 pm to 10 am

Tuesday	Sunset to 10 am
Wednesday	7 pm to 10 am
Thursday	Sunset to 10 am
Friday	7 pm to 10 am
Saturday	7 pm to 10 am
Sunday	6 pm to 10 am

All motorized craft move in a counterclockwise direction. Boats must maintain a 100-foot distance from all piers and buoys. Personal watercrafts are restricted to slow-no-wake anytime the craft is within 200 feet of the shoreline. Report violations to police dispatch, 843-2371

2016 BOAT LAUNCH FEES

The boat launch fees at Paddock and Hooker lakes will increase this year. The daily launch fee will increase from \$5 to \$7.00. You may purchase an annual pass, for residents the cost will be \$35 for one lake and \$45 for both lakes. Non-residents will pay \$40 for one lake and \$55 for both lakes. The purpose for the increase is to raise capital for the future replacement and repair of the Paddock Lake boat landing.

GOLF CART SEASON

The 2016 golf cart registration is in full swing. To be able to operate your golf carts legally on the village road right of way you must register your golf cart every year with the village. In order to register you must not owe any money to the village and the golf cart needs to be inspected by the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department. Please pick up a registration form at the Village Hall.



EMERALD ASH BORER

The Village Board has established the Ash Tree Removal Assistance Program to combat the spread of the invasive insect, the Emerald Ash Borer. ACCEPTABLE PHOTO IDS FOR VOTING IN WISCONSIN

Information Provided by the State of Wisconsin Government Accountability Board

Q: Do I Need A Special Voter ID Card?

A: There is not a separate "Voter ID card. There are many forms of photo ID, which you may have, that can be used to vote. Anyone with a valid Wisconsin driver license or Wisconsin state ID card, or any of the documents listed below, already has the photo ID they need for voting purposes.

Q: What Can I Use As Photo ID To Vote?

A: The following photo IDs are acceptable for voting purposes, and can be unexpired or expired after the date of the most recent general election (currently November 4, 2014 election):

A State of Wisconsin Driver's License, even if driving privileges are revoked or suspended; A State of Wisconsin Identification Card (ID); A Military ID card issued by a U.S. uniformed service; A U.S. passport book or card.

The following photo IDs are also acceptable for voting purposes:

A certificate of naturalization that was issued not earlier than two years prior to the election. A driver license or state ID card receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days); An identification card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Wisconsin;

A photo identification card issued by a Wisconsin accredited university or college that contains the following:

Date the card was issued; Signature of Student; Expiration date no later than two years after the date of issuance; The university or college ID must be accompanied by a separate document that proves enrollment, such as a tuition fee receipt, enrollment verification letter, or class schedule.

Q: What Will The Poll Worker Be Looking At On My Photo ID?

A: They will be looking for the following:

A photograph that reasonably resembles the elector; The electors name must conform to the name on their voter registration. Conform does not mean the name must be identical to the name on the voter registration; If the ID has an expiration date, it must meet the requirements listed above.

Acceptable Photo ID **DOES NOT** have to include a current address.

Q: Are There Any Photo IDs I Cannot Use To Vote?

A: Yes. The following photo ID's are **NOT** acceptable for voting purposes:

A Military Veteran Affairs ID; A State of Federal government employee ID; An out-of-state driver's license or identification card; An employment ID; A membership or organization ID; A Certificate of Citizenship; Any ID not listed on the previous page

Q: Are There Any Photo IDs That Can Be Used For Voting That Do Not Have A Photo On Them?

A: Yes. The following documents, which do not contain a photo, can be used for voting purposes:


A citation or notice of intent to revoke or suspend a driver's license, which is dated within 60 days of the election. If your driver's license has been taken away by law enforcement or a court, you may present written documentation for the fact in order to vote without your photo ID; A State of Wisconsin, DOT issued identification card without a photo, issued to those electors with a religious objection to being photographed.

Q: Is There Anyone Who Does Not Need To Provide A Photo ID?

A: Yes. The following electors do **NOT** need to provide a photo ID:

Confidential electors are always exempt from photo ID requirements. Confidential electors have applied for this status with their municipal clerk; have presented a court order, a letter from law enforcement, a letter from the staff of a domestic abuse shelter, or the staff of an agency assisting victims of domestic abuse; Active Military and Permanent Overseas voters are **NOT** required to provide a photo ID when they vote by absentee ballot, but if they vote in-person, they must present photo ID; Indefinitely Confined voters. These voters who receive an absentee ballot permanently due to age, illness, infirmity, or disability. These voters can provide a witness signature on their absentee ballot certificate instead of showing photo ID; if they vote in-person, they must present a photo ID
