This is your opportunity to get rid of all those things that have accumulated in the garage, basement, etc. On May 12, 2018 from 8:00A.M. until noon. there will be dumpsters at the public works facility at the east end of 62nd Street. Residents are invited to dispose of their unwanted items at this time. There will be a Village employee on site to help you.

Sorry, some things are **not** accepted. Do not bring tires, paints, solvents, oil, **pesticides**, or any other hazardous material.

Also, on May 12, 2018, the Village of Paddock Lake will be accepting electronics (computers, telephones, printers, etc. and televisions) at NO charge drop off will be at the Village Public Works facility at 23201 62nd St., Paddock Lake. Hours of drop off are 8:00 am until noon.

Projects for 2018

The Village will be conducting various improvements and repair projects throughout the Village this spring and summer. The following is a brief description of those projects. Please check the website for additional details:

- * 2018 street improvement project includes 74th St, 72nd St, 245th Ave and 61st St
- * Sanitary sewer collection system rehabilitation, north central portion of village and the Dells subdivision
- * Tree removal
- * Storm sewer ditch line and driveway culvert repairs in various areas

All motorized craft move in a counterclockwise direction. Boats must maintain a 100-foot distance from all piers and buoys. Personal watercrafts are restricted to slow-no-wake anytime the craft is within 200 feet of the shoreline. Report violations to police dispatch, 843-2371

2018 BOAT LAUNCH FEES

The boat launch fees at Paddock and Hooker lakes will remain the same. The daily launch fee will be \$7.00. You may purchase an annual pass, for residents the cost is \$35 for one lake and \$45 for both lakes. Non-residents pay \$40 for one lake and \$55 for both lakes.

Pesky Mosquitos

There are several preventative steps our residents can take to reduce mosquitos. The following are those steps:

- * Empty containers with standing water after each rain fall
- * Ensure that roof rain gutters are functional and have no standing water or wet leaves.
- * Areas in yards that hold water can be treated with vegetable oil or dishwashing soap at a rate of one table spoon per 100 square feet of standing surface water.
- * Clean out wet leaves and yard waste from inside driveway culverts and ditch lines.
- * Trim trees and shrubs to allow sunlight to reach shaded areas.
- * Remove wet leaves and or vegetation from beneath wood frame decks and patios.



Property Maintenance Violations

Just a few things to keep in mind:

- * All vehicle parking shall be on hard paved or gravel surface. NO extended parking on lawns.
- * Trash and recycling totes and bulk garbage may not be placed out at roads edge sooner than 12 hours before scheduled pick up.
- * Temporary canvas or hooped sheds are not permitted within the village.
- * All buildings must display house numbers
- * Yard waste shall NOT be placed at roads edge for collection except during scheduled collection period 's April through May and October through December.
