DOG LICENSE INFORMATION

Dogs are required to be licensed in the Village of Paddock Lake. The due date for obtaining your dog's license is March 31<sup>st</sup> of every year. The fee for spayed/neutered dogs is \$5 per animal/per year. The fee for dogs not spayed or neutered is \$11 per animal/per year. If the license fee is not applied for prior to April 1<sup>st</sup>, there will be an additional late fee of \$10 per dog.

All dogs over the age of 5 months need to be licensed. We will need proof of a current rabies vaccination. An invoice or statement from your veterinarian which shows the rabies tag number and expiration date is acceptable proof.

\*No more than 3 dogs over the age of 3 months shall be kept in any dwelling unit in the village.

\*Dogs are regulated by sections 174.05 and 174.07 of the Wisconsin Statutes and chapter 19 of the village ordinances.

Licensing helps reunite lost dogs with their owners.

With proof of current dog license and rabies vaccination, your dog can run off-leash in the Kenosha County Dog Parks. Licensing is important to family emergency preparedness planning to ensure a dog and its owner is reunited in case of separation during an emergency.

Information about licensed dogs assists in the medical follow-up of individuals potentially exposed to infected dogs, especially important during rabies outbreaks.
