Think your dog is something special? Do they have a sparkling personality or a special talent? Apply for DOG OF THE MONTH!!



The 2019 golf cart registration is in full swing. To be able to operate your golf carts legally on the village road right of way you must register your golf cart **every year** with the village. In order to register you must not owe any money to the village and the golf cart needs to be inspected by the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department. Please pick up a registration form at the Village Hall. The permit fee is \$50.00.

## SPRING LEAF COLLECTION

Spring leaf collection runs from

April 22 - May17, 2019

Please remember that only leaves will be picked up. Do not rake rocks, sticks, brush, dog droppings or other objects into the leaf piles. They are very dangerous to workers and will clog and damage the equipment. Leaves must be raked as close to the road as possible.

Do not rake leaves near mail-boxes, the vacuum hose cannot reach around the posts. If you bag your leaves, the bags will not be returned.

- Spot repair of pavement



## THOSE \*^#@\*!\* MOSQUITOS

Let's hope the polar vortex did away with the mosquitos! There are several preventative steps our residents can take to reduce mosquitos such as:

- Empty containers with standing water after each rain fall
- Ensure that roof rain gutters are functional and have no standing water or wet leaves.
- Areas in yards that hold water can be treated with vegetable oil or dishwashing soap at a rate of one table spoon per 100 square feet of standing surface water.
- Clean out wet leaves and yard waste from inside driveway culverts and ditch lines.

- Trim trees and shrubs to allow sunlight to reach shaded areas.
- Remove wet leaves and or vegetation from beneath wood frame decks and patios.

#### Slow-No-Wake Hours



All motorized craft move in a counterclockwise direction. Boats must maintain a 100-foot distance from all piers and buoys. Personal watercrafts are restricted to slow-no-wake anytime the craft is within 200 feet of the shoreline. Report violations to police dispatch, 843-2371

### 2019 BOAT LAUNCH FEES

The boat launch fees at Paddock and Hooker lakes will remain the same. The daily launch fee will be \$7.00. You may purchase an annual pass, for residents the cost is \$35 for one lake and \$45 for both lakes. Non-residents pay \$40 for one lake and \$55 for both lakes.

## KENOSHA COUNTY LEAD -FREE COMMUNITIES PARTNERSHIP

The Kenosha County Health Department has a program available to have your home tested for lead. The program is federally funded seeking to reduce lead hazards within homes built before or in 1978.

Owner occupied or rental homes are welcome to apply. Homes must be in good structural condition (e.g. roof, foundation) in order to perform inspections.

## MOST COMMON PROPERTY MAINTAINANCE VIOLATIONS

Trash and recycling totes and bulk garbage may not be placed out at roads edge sooner than 12 hours before scheduled pick up.

Temporary canvas or hooped sheds are not permitted within the village.

Storage of children toys, boats, auto parts, firewood piles are not permitted to be stored in front yards.

All buildings must display house numbers

Yard waste shall not be placed at roads edge for collection except during scheduled collection period 's April through May and October through December.

No person owning property within the Village shall permit to grow or pollinate upon his premises any weeds or grasses at a height exceeding ten (10) inches.


## New Bulk Pick-up procedures
