2020 GENERAL ELECTION



There are several options to cast your ballot for the November 3, 2020 General Election (and every election)

Polls will be open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm at the Paddock Lake Village Hall. Our election workers will be happy to assist you along with keeping the facility as clean and safe as possible. Extra efforts will be taken to wipe down election equipment and hand sanitizer will be available.

You can request an absentee ballot from the Village Clerk or online at www.myvote.wi.gov. Please do not forget to include a copy of your photo ID with your request. The last day to request a mailed ballot is October 29th. Please be sure to allow mailing time so the ballot is received on or before election day. You can also place your ballot in the secure drop box located on the front of the building by 8:00 pm on election day.

Voters can also cast a ballot in-person via absentee ballot at the Village Hall during regular business hours, 8:00 am to 4:30 pm. In-person voting starts Tuesday, October 20th and runs through Friday, October 30th.

HOME OWNER TIPS FOR FALL AND WINTER

Some home safety tips:

- Replace batteries in all smoke detectors
- Smoke detectors over 10 years old need to be replaced
- Check fire extinguishers
- Implement an emergency exit plan, practice with all family members
- Clean out roof gutters
- Inspect and clean if necessary the chimney and flues, fireplace, woodstove and other carbon monoxide producing appliances.
- Install working carbon monoxide detectors on each floor of your home.
- Clean clothes dryer vents once every three



Per Ordinance 19.04

(a) Any premises, whether indoors or outdoors, upon which any animal is harbored, shall be maintained in a sanitary condition, and all animal feces must be removed and sanitarily disposed of within twenty-four (24) hours.

WINTER REMINDERS

MAILBOX PREPARDNESS

Now is the time to check mail-boxes and mail box posts to ensure they will withstand a Wisconsin winter. Replace any screws that are missing and replace rotted posts. The Village Public Works Department makes every effort to avoid mail boxes when plowing snow from village streets, but occasionally snow rolling off the plow will damage a mailbox post. We will make every effort to prevent this from happening.

WINTER PARKING

Whenever there is an accumulation of snow of one inch or more, or whenever icing conditions are prevalent which requires sanding or salting, no person, except emergency personnel on official emergency calls shall park any vehicle on any village street, alley or right of way within the Village of Paddock Lake at any time of day or night.

ROAD SALT

The Village Board has determined to reduce the amount of road salt used on village roads during the winter by 40% or more to save the environment. Please remember this while driving on village roads this winter.



FALL LEAF PICK UP

It is that time of year again; we will be starting the fall leaf pick up. Pick up date starts October 19th and will end on December 4th. Please remember that only leaves will be picked up. Do not rake rocks, wires, brush, dog droppings or other objects into the leaf piles. They are very dangerous to workers and will clog and damage the equipment. Leaves must be raked as close to the road as possible. Do not rake leaves near mailboxes, the vacuum hose can not reach around the posts.

If you bag your leaves, the bags will not be returned.

Do not wait until the last week to rake leaves.



Leaves will be picked up by zones; Zone 1 will be picked up on Monday, Zone 2 on Wednesday, Zone 3 on Thursday and Zone 4 on Friday.

Create a separate pile for brush and tree clippings.

E WASTE RECYCLING DAY

December 5, 2020 from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm at the Public Works site 23201 62nd St. The village will take all those electronic devices (anything with a power cord) that the garbage may no longer pick up. There is no charge for village residents.

BULK PICK - UP PROCEDURES

Bulk items will no longer be automatically collected every week on your day of service. Residents may still have free bulk collection but must call Johns Disposal 48 hours in advance to schedule pick up. Please do not place items out by the curb if you have not scheduled pick-up. Bulk

CREDIT / DEBIT CARD PAYMENTS

You can pay your quarterly utility bill, court fines and property taxes through the on-line GOVPAYNET system. There is a 2.65% service fee per credit card transaction and a 1.15% fee per debit card transaction. You can access the site through our website:

PAYING YOUR TAXES

Tax payments must be postmarked by January 31, 2021. Taxes paid by January 31, 2021 must be made payable to: Village of Paddock Lake – Treasurer 6969 236th Ave, Salem, WI 53168. You also have the option of paying your taxes in two equal installments. If you decide to take advantage of that option, the first half needs to be paid to the Village of Paddock Lake Treasurer by January 31, 2021. The second payment must be made no later than July 31, 2021 to: Kenosha County – Treasurer.

Village Hall is open from 8am to 4:30pm Monday – Friday during normal work weeks. Over the holidays, there are a few days when the Village Hall offices will be closed: Thursday, December 24th, Friday, December 25th, Thursday, December 31st and Friday, January 1, 2021.



When you don't pay your quarterly sewer bill and allow it to go on your tax bill it could cost you over \$160.00 a year! There is a 5% penalty for not paying by the due date. On top of this there is a 10% penalty added to your bill when it is put on your property taxes. If you are on municipal water the cost is even higher. The delinquent charges added to your tax bill are NOT deductible for income tax purposes. They may also cause your escrow payments to go up.
