

#### Water Softener Tips to help reduce chloride

Check to see how your softener is calibrated. Some softeners are preset for the highest hardness setting at the factory. This setting may be as hard as 30 grains. Reset the hardness to 20 grains. Soften only water used inside the home. Do not treat the outside hose faucets.

Check the timer. When was it last adjusted? Many of us move into a house or purchase a water softener and never check it again. Children move out or other factors come into play that affects the amount of water we use. If your softener is regulated by a timer, you may be able to increase the interval between regeneration cycles without affecting the water quality. Increase the time by one day and see if there is any effect on dish washing and laundry during the next month.

## **GOLF CARTS**



The 2025 golf cart registration is in full swing. To be able to operate your golf carts legally on the village road right of way you must register your golf cart every year with the village. In order to register you must not owe any money to the village (outstanding taxes, unpaid sewer bills or outstanding fines) and the golf cart needs to be inspected by the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department. Please pick up a registration form at the Village Hall or you can print one from our website. The permit fee is \$50.00 and permit stickers must be displayed at all times. All drivers MUST be 16 years of age and possess a valid driver's license. The golf cart season runs from March 1st through the 3rd Saturday in December. The rules and regulations can be found in chapter 44 of the village code of ordinances. ATV's and UTV's are not permitted on village streets. HAVE FUN AND BE SAFE!!!

#### FAQ'S


**Do I live in Salem or Paddock Lake? Isnt it the same thing?** <u>NO</u> it is not the same thing! We have a mailing address of "Salem" but you live in The Village of Paddock Lake if you are receiving this newsletter.

**How do I know if I am on a well?** If you live on the west side of the lake, you are on a well. Most of the homes on the east side of the lake are connected to municipal water, as well as Whitetail Ridge and the businesses along Hwy 50. There are no plans to connect the remainder of the village to the municipal water system.

Will garbage pick-up be delayed because of the holiday? Johns Disposal observes the following holidays: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. Holiday collections may be at an earlier time than normal. If your collection day is BEFORE the Holiday, your pick up day will not be affected. Please be sure to put your refuse and recycling out the night before your scheduled collection day.

Where do I pay the second installment of my property taxes? The second installment of your taxes must be paid to the Kenosha County Treasurer—1010 56th Street, Kenosha WI 53140. The Village does not take tax payments after January 31st.

**Do I need a permit to work on my house?** It depends on the project, we suggest you check with the building inspector before starting any projects. If you are caught doing work without a permit, the fee is tripled. Contact Tim Popanda—Building Inspector 262-843-2713
