SPRING LEAF COLLECTION

Spring leaf collection runs from
April 13- May 8, 2026

Please remember that only leaves will be picked up. Do not rake rocks, sticks, brush, dog droppings or other objects into the leaf piles. They are very dangerous to workers and will clog and damage the equipment. Leaves must be raked as close to the road as possible. Do not rake leaves near mailboxes, the vacuum hose cannot reach around the posts. If you bag your leaves, the bags will not be returned.

Zone 1 = Monday

Zone 2 = Wednesday

Zone 3 = Thursday

Zone 4 = Friday

To ensure pickup please place leaves roadside by 7:00 am on your scheduled day.

DID YOU KNOW??

Salem and Paddock Lake are not the same communities -We have a mailing address of "Salem" but you live in The Village of Paddock Lake if you are receiving this newsletter. They are two different taxing entities with separate governing officials.

Paddock Lake now contracts with Bristol Fire Department for Fire and Rescue Services - As of January 1, 2026 we are pleased to announce our partnership with Bristol.

Only about a third of our community is on "municipal water"- If you live on the west side of the lake, you are on a well. Most of the homes on the east side of the lake are connected to municipal water, as well as Whitetail Ridge Subdivision and the businesses along Hwy 50. There are no plans to connect the remainder of the village to the municipal water system.

You pay close to \$200 extra a year if you let your sewer bill go to your taxes. Even more if you are on municipal water! You are receiving a late fee every quarter, in addition a 10% penalty is added to the total balance when we have to put it on your property tax bill as a special assessment. You are also not eligible for a golf cart permit or the sewer incentive program user fee credit.

TREE PLANTING PROGRAM



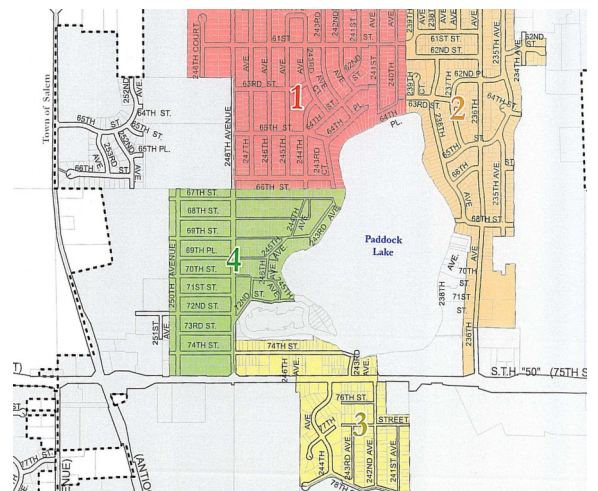
The Village has ordered various species of tree saplings for our residents. These saplings are free to Village residents. We will post on the website when the trees arrive and are ready for pick up at the village hall.

Sewer Customer Incentive Program

The incentive program is in full swing! Don't worry, if you missed your chance to receive a credit of \$50 on your first quarter sewer bill, you can still apply to receive a user-fee credit on your 2nd quarter bill. The program was developed to educate Village residential sewer customers on the proper use of their sanitary sewer collection and treatment system by encouraging the reduction of fats, oils, grease, sanitary wipes, feminine hygiene products and food waste being flushed down toilets and drains. There is also a Water Softener Optimization Credit program available. The forms are available at the Village Hall and on our website.

Water Softener Tips to help reduce chloride

Check to see how your softener is calibrated. Some softeners are preset for the highest hardness setting at the factory. This setting may be as hard as 30 grains. Reset the hardness to 20 grains. Soften only water used inside the home. Do not treat the outside hose faucets.

Check the timer. When was it last adjusted? Many of us move into a house or purchase a water softener and never check it again. Children move out or other factors come into play that affects the amount of water we use. If your softener is regulated by a timer, you may be able to increase the interval between regeneration cycles without affecting the water quality. Increase the time by one day and see if there is any effect on dish washing and laundry during the next month.

GOLF CARTS



The 2026 golf cart registration events will take place on Saturday, **March 7th** and Saturday, **May 9th** from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. Our goal is to streamline the annual permitting process by having residents attend one of the two events where Kenosha County Sheriff's Deputies will be present to perform the inspection. Please bring proof of insurance. All fees owed to the village must be paid (utility bills, taxes, fines) and staff will be present to collect the \$50 permit fee and issue the 2026 sticker. Inspections will be done on a first come basis. If you are unable to attend one of the events, the Village will still process golf cart registrations in the office as usual.

REMINDER: ATV's and UTV's are NOT permitted on village streets!

ELECTRONIC WASTE DROP-OFF

On Saturday, **May 9, 2026 from 9:00 A.M. until 12:00 P.M.** there will be dumpsters at the public works facility at the east end of 62nd Street. Residents are invited to dispose of their unwanted e-waste items (computers, telephones, televisions and anything with a power cord) at NO charge.

Sorry, some things are **not** accepted. Do not bring bulk items, tires, refrigerators, air conditioners, paints, solvents, oil, pesticides, or any other hazardous material.

Drop off will be at the Village Public Works facility at 23201 62nd St., Paddock Lake. Hours of drop off are 9:00 am until noon. There will be a Village employee on site to help you.

RECYCLING NEWS from JOHNS

The Village will no longer be collecting batteries in the office. Johns Disposal advises the following:



Alkaline and Zinc-carbon batteries:

Can be safely put in your household trash.

Examples: AA, AAA, C-cell, D-cell and 9 volt



Button-Cell or Coin batteries:

Put each battery in an individual, clear plastic bag or tape each battery's terminal with clear packing tape.

If they say "lithium" do not put in the trash or municipal recycling bins.

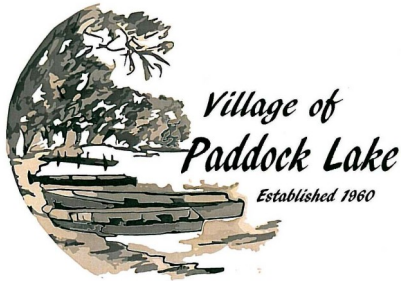


Lithium Single-use batteries:

Put each battery in an individual, clear plastic bag or tape each battery's terminals with clear packing tape.

Do not put in the trash or municipal recycling bins.

- A lithium battery may spark and cause fires if damaged or the terminal ends touch
- Do NOT put rechargeable batteries in the trash or municipal recycling bins
